# HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR PRESCHOOL ENTRANCE

#### DTaP/DTP:

MINIMUM OF 4 DOSES

#### **POLIO:**

MINIMUM OF 3 DOSES

#### **MEASLES:**

1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1ST BIRTHDAY

#### **RUBELLA:**

1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1<sup>ST</sup> BIRTHDAY

#### **MUMPS:**

1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1ST BIRTHDAY

## **HAEMOPHILUS B** (Hib):

MINIMUM 1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1ST BIRTHDAY

#### **VARICELLA (CHICKEN POX):**

1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1<sup>ST</sup> BIRTHDAY (LABORATORY EVIDENCE OF IMMUNITY, PHYSICIAN 'S STATEMENT OR A PARENTAL STATEMENT OF PREVIOUS VARICELLA DISEASE IS ACCEPTABLE)

#### PNEUMOCOCCAL VACCINE:

MINIMUM OF 1 DOSE ON OR AFTER THE 1ST BIRTHDAY

#### **INFLUENZA VACCINE:**

1 DOSE ANNUALLY TO BE GIVEN BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 1 AND DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR

#### **HEPATITIS B:**

RECOMMENDED: 3 DOSES REQUIRED PRIOR TO KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE

### **CURRENT PHYSICAL EXAM:**

WITHIN 365 DAYS OF ENTRANCE; SHOULD BE ON HOWELL HEALTH FORM

# **Tuberculosis Testing in New Jersey Schools**

Justification: To limit tuberculosis screening in New Jersey schools to teachers/other employees and only those students who are at highest risk for latent TB infection.

- I. Only a positive interferon gamma release assay test result or a Mantoux intradermal test using 5 TU of stabilized PPD tuberculin skin test result measuring ≥ 10mm of induration shall be considered a "significant reaction" and evidence of latent TB infection.
- II. The following tuberculosis testing requirements apply to <u>ALL</u> school districts:
  - 1. Students born in a country that is not listed on page 3 and entering school in the U.S. for the first time, regardless of age or grade.
  - 2. <u>Students transferring into the New Jersey school system directly from a country not listed on page 3, regardless of age or grade.</u>

#### **EXCEPTIONS FOR BOTH GROUPS OF STUDENTS LISTED ABOVE:**

<u>Entering at preschool through grade 5:</u> Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has documentation of an IGRA or Mantoux tuberculin skin test at the age of three years or older, regardless of the result of that test.

<u>Entering at grades 6 through 12:</u> Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has documentation of a negative tuberculosis test in the last six months or a positive test, regardless when this test was done.

Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has attended school in another state prior to entering the New Jersey school system.

Any student with parents claiming religious exemption (TB-8 Form) cannot be compelled to submit to tuberculosis testing. In these instances, a symptom assessment must be done (TB-8 Form). If TB-like symptoms are reported, a physician must document that the student does not have active disease. Each school district is responsible for determining the criteria essential to document a valid religious exemption.
