

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE

DTP: 4 DOSES WITH ONE DOSE GIVEN ON OR AFTER THE 4TH BIRTHDAY, OR ANY 5 DOSES

POLIO: 3 DOSES, WITH ONE DOSE GIVEN ON OR AFTER THE 4TH BIRTHDAY OR ANY 4 DOSES

MEASLES: 2 DOSES OF A LIVE MEASLES CONTAINING VACCINE ON OR AFTER 1ST BIRTHDAY

RUBELLA: 1 DOSE OF A LIVE RUBELLA CONTAINING VACCINE ON OR AFTER 1ST BIRTHDAY

MUMPS: 1 DOSE OF A LIVE MUMPS CONTAINING VACCINE ON OR AFTER 1ST BIRTHDAY

VARICELLA (CHICKEN POX): 1 DOSE ON OR AFTER 1ST BIRTHDAY

HEPATITIS B: 3 DOSES PRIOR TO SCHOOL ENTRANCE

PHYSICAL EXAM: **SHOULD BE DATED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1, 2022**

MANTOUX SKIN TEST: SEE NJ STATE REQUIREMENTS

In order for your child to attend school in September, you must provide any Health Requirements not submitted at the time of your child's registration to your child's School Nurse prior to September 1. If your child's birthdate precludes him/her from receiving the necessary Health Requirements prior to September 1, please contact your child's School Nurse.

Tuberculosis Testing in New Jersey Schools

Justification: To limit tuberculosis screening in New Jersey schools to teachers/other employees and only those students who are at highest risk for latent TB infection.

- I. **Only a positive interferon gamma release assay test result or a Mantoux intradermal test using 5 TU of stabilized PPD tuberculin skin test result measuring ≥ 10 mm of induration shall be considered a “significant reaction” and evidence of latent TB infection.**
- II. **The following tuberculosis testing requirements apply to ALL school districts:**
 1. **Students born in a country that is not listed on page 3 and entering school in the U.S. for the first time, regardless of age or grade.**
 2. **Students transferring into the New Jersey school system directly from a country not listed on page 3, regardless of age or grade.**

EXCEPTIONS FOR BOTH GROUPS OF STUDENTS LISTED ABOVE:

Entering at preschool through grade 5: Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has documentation of an IGRA or Mantoux tuberculin skin test at the age of three years or older, regardless of the result of that test.

Entering at grades 6 through 12: Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has documentation of a negative tuberculosis test in the last six months or a positive test, regardless when this test was done.

Tuberculosis testing is not required if the student has attended school in another state prior to entering the New Jersey school system.

Any student with parents claiming religious exemption (TB-8 Form) cannot be compelled to submit to tuberculosis testing. In these instances, a symptom assessment must be done (TB-8 Form). If TB-like symptoms are reported, a physician must document that the student does not have active disease. Each school district is responsible for determining the criteria essential to document a valid religious exemption.

Students entering a U.S. school for the first time in New Jersey or transferring into a New Jersey school from ANY country NOT listed above must receive an IGRA or Mantoux tuberculin skin test unless they meet an exemption criterion.
